

Boating on Lake Heritage

No Wake Zones

- Within 100 feet of shoreline
- Within 100 feet of docks
- Within 100 feet of dam/spillway
- Within any cove
- All of the Lake at Sunset when the strobe light is illuminated on the dam (Max. 5MPH)
- Within 100 feet of any downed skier/tuber
- Beyond the 3 buoys at the North end of the lake

Boat Operation

No inboard or inboard/outboard (stern drive) over 21ft and 140HP

No pontoons over 21 feet and 90 HP

No outboard, including sailboats over 19ft and 90 HP

All boats must be registered with the LHPOA annually and must display the appropriate association sticker & Lot Number

Remember it's illegal to:

Allow persons 11 years of age or younger to operate a watercraft greater than 25HP

Operate a watercraft in a reckless manner

Operate a Motorboat with a person riding outside of the passenger area

Enjoy The Lake

On Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays water skiing hours will be from 9:00AM until the strobe light above the dam is on

Skiing and Tubing, on the Lake shall be in a counterclockwise direction

*Remember, no more than two skiers or other towed persons per boat is allowed on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays**

Make sure you have enough lifejackets for everyone on board.

Paddleboarders and kayakers must have a life jacket readily accessible

Never operate a boat within 100 feet of any person towed behind another boat.

ALL BOATS MUST STAY WELL CLEAR OF SWIMMERS AT ALL TIMES

Powerboats should always yield to non-power vessels; however both watercrafts have an obligation to avoid a collision.

It is illegal to operate a boat while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance

Be mindful of music volume, sound travels quite far over water

You are obligated to stop and assist a boat that is stranded

*except by written approval of the Board of Directors (for Regatta, Special Events, etc.

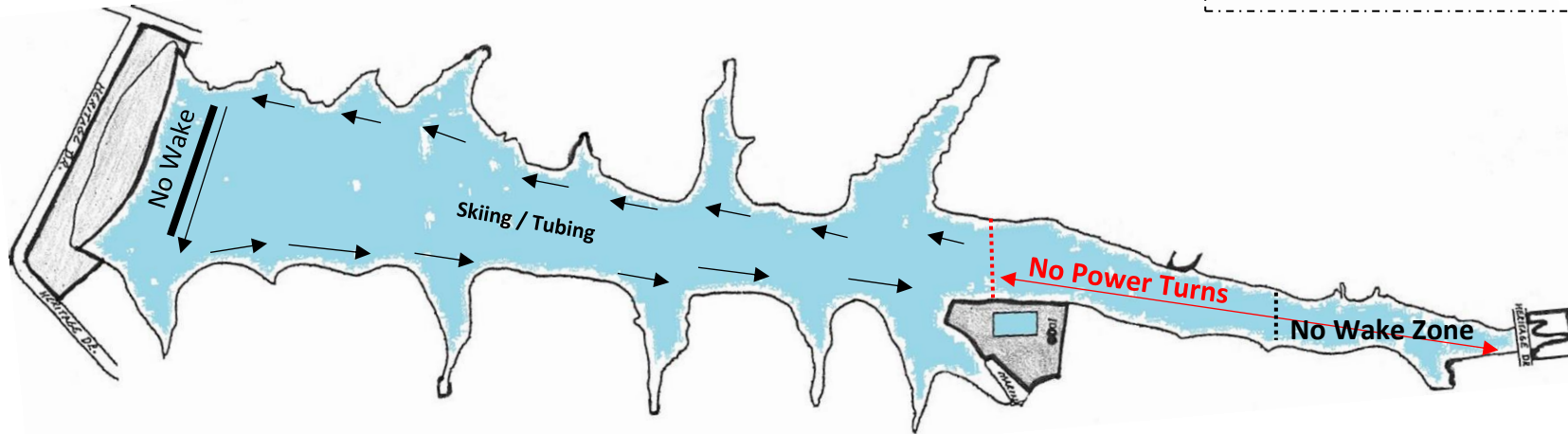

LHPOA Rules

- Counter-Clockwise Directional Travel
- Be Aware of No Wake Zones
- Maximum Lake Speed limit of 45MPH
- Boats must display USCG Approved running lights when the dam strobe light is on
- Boats operating after sunset (when the dam light comes on) shall not create any wake and are not allowed to exceed 5 mph or tow any skier or tuber

Check your Personal Flotation Devices

- All boats must have a USCG-approved wearable life jacket on board for each person.
- Children 12 and under **MUST** wear a life jacket (State Law)
- All skiers and anyone towed behind vessels must wear a life jacket
- Boats 16 feet and over must have a throwable device (ring buoy, life ring or buoyant seat cushion) on board.

Safe Boating

- Be alert for downed Skiers/Tubers
- Tow ropes shall be no longer than 80 feet
- To prevent propeller-related accidents, turn off your engine before picking up any skier
- Boating Safety Education Certificate required and must be carried, for all operators including Guests, born on or after January 1, 1982 and operating a boat of 25 HP or greater.
