Hello, Lake Heritage!

Happy April! Entering into this new fiscal year, there are changes to occur. To start, Building Permit fees will be increased to \$35, Building Inspection fees are now \$115 and a Resale Certificate is now \$100.00. Another change is that I have been appointed Secretary for the year. This does not make me a voting member of the Board of Directors, I have been given the duties of keeping the minutes of meetings and being the custodian of the corporate records of Lake Heritage.

I would like to take the time to thank previous Board Members, Keith Ballantyne, Tanya Keller and Mike Waller. They were ¾ of the Board Officer team when I started at Lake Heritage in May 2022. I am grateful to have been given the opportunity to work with them along with the other members of the 2022 Board of Directors.

Thank you Tanya and Mike for maintaining the Office duties during the time where there were no staff, followed by then training our previous Community Manager and myself. In the next few weeks, my goals are to hire an Admin Assistant for the office, begin the hiring of Lifeguards and planning for our 2023 Pool Season. These hirings will continue with or without LHPOA moving forward with an Association Management Company.

I look forward to working with our new Board of Directors this year. I am hopeful that together, with the membership, we will better Lake Heritage as a whole. I have heard many comments about how things were done here in the past, some good things, others not so good, and while I appreciate the history of Lake Heritage, the only thing that stays the same is that everything changes. Progress is inevitable, let's make the tomorrow of Lake Heritage better than it was yesterday.

As the weather begins to become warmer and brighter, Spring cleaning and outdoor maintenance begins; please be mindful of the following:

- When mowing, mow away from your swales and/or the lake.
- Fertilizer containing Phosphorus should not be used within Lake Heritage, this includes *natural phosphorus*. If you outsource your landscaping needs, please ensure the businessperson maintaining your yard is aware and is not using phosphorus fertilizer.
- Brush Drop Off will begin this month, please keep in mind that limbs larger than 3inches in diameter, grass or garden clippings/leaves, lumber/plywood and root clumps are not accepted.
- Kayak Racks are now available for use located in various rec areas. They are first come first serve and should serve as temporary storage for your canoes, kayaks, SUP.
- Boater Safety! Please refer to LHPOA's and PA Fish and Boat Commision's basic rules of good boating practices. There will be a Boat Safety Course offered to members on Saturday, April 29th. Email the office to RSVP for the event.

The next meeting of the Board of Directors will be on Friday, April 14th at 7:00 pm. This meeting will be in person and on Zoom, more details will be sent out in an email blast.


Lake Heritage Property Owners Association Treasurer's Report


I want to take a moment to thank those I worked with during my time as Treasurer, Members of the Finance committee who provided a firm background into the established finances of the Association. There is much institutional knowledge within that committee on the legacy of past financial positions and decisions. Rick Franzese, Tom Gary, Ron Brown, Betsy Meyer, Dick DeHaan, Doug Rudisill, Mike Lawn, Steve Dwyer, and Jay Schmitt. Their input and guidance was invaluable.

The Association is in a good spot when it comes to its finances. \$1.2 Million, is currently with ACNB who are investing on behalf of the association. As at the end of Feb the return on CD investments is between 4.8% - 5.15%. The last year has seen revenue increasing, as well as some delinguent accounts being settled without the need for court action. There are still some major outstanding delinguent accounts which have vet to be settled, an ever on-going task. Staff are paid, the lights have been kept on, and there is money in the bank

Lake Heritage Scholarship Opportunity



Each year Lake Heritage graduating high school seniors from a Gettysburg area school or home school program who currently live in our community are given a tremendous opportunity to compete for a \$1000 scholarship set up by The Lake Heritage Fishing and Women's Clubs' Scholarship Committee.

The Committee is comprised of individuals who live at Lake Heritage and have professional experience in evaluating projects such as essays and the overall qualifications. They follow specific guidelines in the selection process:

1) The graduating high school student is a family member of the LHPOA resident.

2) The student is enrolled in an education program at Gettysburg School District, Littlestown School District, Delone Catholic School, GED program or a home-school program.

3) The student must complete the scholarship application form completely. Incomplete forms are immediately disqualified.

4) Applicant's intended Education Plan specifics must be included.

5) A self-written essay answering the question...How has living in Lake Heritage benefitted your physical, social, and mental growth... and providing examples to support that answer.

6) Reference letters of recommendation from two adults not related to the candidate who can validate the applicant's character, education experience and goals, need to be included.

7) A list of community service organizations with descriptions of participation which the candidate has performed. Also, information regarding extra-curricular activities through the candidate's high school career also needs to be provided.

Application forms are available at Lake Heritage Office or from the student's guidance counselor and are to be returned by the deadline of Monday, April 10. Scholarship Winner(s) will be notified in May. Presentation of Scholarship Awards will be given at the Fishing Club monthly meeting.

Lake Heritage Election Night 2023 Story and Photos by Pete Vogel


At 6:00 PM on the night of March 15, 2023, the Nominating Committee: Tanya Keller - Chair, Jeff Bristol, Linda Helsey, Doug Rudisill, and Mike Waller, gathered in the Community Center to sort and count the 347 ballots submitted by the Membership to see who the winners of the 3 open slots on the Board of Directors were.

There are 4 phases of the ballot counting process. First, the ballots were opened then they were separated by lot number. Next, they were checked to see if they were from Members in good standing. Then the count began. They were read in groups of 40 by Community Manager, Taylor Eiker. As she read them each member of the Committee kept a tally. After each group of 40 they checked to see that each person's tally agreed. Then the big news - the winners were Rich Dooley with 258 votes, Alan Kwiatkowski with 238 and Tom Reidenbach with 188.

The winners were called and gave the following reactions. Top vote-getter Rich Dooley said, "I'm looking forward to serving our community over the next three years. I'd also like to offer my sincere thanks to the Membership for its trust and support. Let's get started!" Alan Kwiatkowski reaction was, "Being offered a new responsibility is undoubtedly a reason for celebration. That being said, serving the Lake Heritage Community is a privilege. I am humbled and honored that members have put their faith and trust in me." Tom Reidenbach was more restrained, "I was excited but still a bit leery. I know that you can't please all the people all the time."

When looking at the issues facing Lake Heritage today, Dooley spoke of improving communications and increasing member input. Kwiatkowski and Reidenbach mentioned the possibility of bringing in a management company. Alan said, "One of the biggest issues facing Lake Heritage today is deciding how our community should be managed. Board members must research and discuss all aspects of community management." Tom had similar feelings, "I feel that one of the biggest issues is the current outside management company issue. What has transpired caught a lot of residents and some Board members by surprise. It seemed like this issue was being rushed to completion without members having any knowledge or information on what was going on."

Our new Board Members were sworn in at the Reorganization Meeting on March 3I. What remains to be seen is who will hold the new vacancy created by the recent resignation of former Board President Tanya Keller. That will be decided by the Board in the near future.

Newly elected Board Member, Rich Dooley, was elected President of the LHPOA Board of Directors at the Annual Reorganization meeting held on March 30, 2023. He pledged for better communication with the membership among other things to improve the quality of life at Lake Heritage.

The Reorganization meeting is held each year to swear in the newly elected members fill the officers of the board. Along with Rich Dooley, newly elected Board members Alan Kwiatkowski and Tom Reidenbach were sworn in.

The new Officers for 2023-24 are Phil Gomer 1st Vice President, Richard Ginnever, 2nd Vice President, Alan Kwiatkowski is our new Treasurer and Jake Schindel was made Assistant Treasurer. Taylor Eiker was appointed Secretary to the Board. This represents a significant change from previous years. The positions of Second Vice President and Assistant Treasurer are new positions. A major change is making our Community Manager, Taylor Eiker, Secretary. In the past, this was done by an elected Board Member. At a discussion held last week, it was determined that since Taylor records the meetings, she is best qualified to perform the Secretarial duties. With that said, she is not a voting member of the Board.

In other business, the Board voted to authorize our Safety and Security officers to enforce all motor vehicle and boating regulations, they voted in our Accounting and Legal Counsel, appointed members to the Fines/Suspension Review Board. They also authorized the following clubs for 2023-24: The Fishing Club, Women's Club, Ski Club, Creativity Club, Fun and Fitness Club, Bridge Club and Kids Club.

Still to be determined by the new Board are the Committees and their Chairs. This will be determined in the next couple of weeks in time for the annual membership meeting on Friday, April 14.

Saturday, June 3, 2023 7:00am-5:00pm

Contest Rules and Regulations:

1. DATE/TIME: Saturday, June 3, 2023, from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

2. Registration: No pre-registration necessary but entrants must read the rules before fishing.

3. Participation: Open to all Lake Heritage Property Owners. Owners' non-resident family and friends are welcome, BUT the lot owner must be present at the weigh-in. Lot owners are responsible for all their participants, whether family or guests. All Lake Heritage Property Owners' Association Rules and Regulations must be observed.

4. Weigh-in: 2:00PM until 5:00 PM at the Fishing Point (below the Community Center). You will need to present the lot owner's name, lot number and names of participants.

5. Weigh-in Procedure: Fish may be brought to be weighed in plastic buckets (preferred), plastic bags or coolers. Fish must be weighed at the area and time specified in paragraph 4. Fish to be disposed of do not have to be kept cold.

6. Acceptable Fish: NEW for 2023, Catfish and White Perch may be brought in for the weigh-in. Must be caught during the hours of the tournament only. Anyone bringing in fish caught outside the hours of the tournament hours will be disqualified.

7. Awards: Money (.50 cents per pound) and medals will be presented to children 16-under as you weigh-in.

8. Tackle Rules: All fish must be caught on conventional fishing tackle with hooks and live or artificial bait. You must supply your own bait. Fish may not be netted out of lake, unless first caught on a hook. The number of rods and hooks legal under PA laws are allowed.

9. Licensing: All adults and anyone 16 years or older must have a PA fishing license. Any boy or girl 15 years old or younger does not need a PA fishing license.

10. Penalties: Killing of wrong fish will be punishable by weight deduction before reward. The weight reduction is 8-lbs. for each wrong fish; cash equivalent of \$4.00. As stated above, fish not caught during the tournament hours should not be turned in. If you do, you will be disgualified.

11. Fish Retention: People desiring to keep the white perch to eat should keep them alive and cold or otherwise preserved. Bring them to weigh-in to be counted before gutting.

12. Littering: Do not litter with any material including bait containers and dead fish. Dead fish will be disposed of by tournament officials.

13. Fishing Areas: Everyone may fish from all public access areas around the lake as well as from LHPOA registered boats containing all safety requirements mandated by PA law. You may fish from private lots on the waterfront only with the permission of the owners.

14 Tournament End Time: The tournament is over at precisely 5:00 PM. You must be in line at the weigh-in station by 5:00PM or your fish will not be weighed.

- Ability to become familiar with and enforce LHPOA Pool Rules and Procedures.
- Ability to supervise both children and adults in a courteous and effect manner.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.










