Community Manager Report

Hello, Lake Heritage!

I'd like to start my report off with a selfish milestone, as it is with this June Breeze that officially marks my one-year work anniversary at Lake Heritage. I began last May as the new Administrative Assistant and have since been given the role of Community Manager. I am extremely grateful for the opportunities that I have been presented with in my tenure here, and plan to further my education with respect to Community Management.

Thank you to the membership, the 2022 and current 2023 Board of Directors, and to my team of staff for allowing me to serve you these last 12 months, it truly has been a blessing. I love coming to work every day and look forward to seeing all of your smiling faces.

Now on to business:

In my last newsletter report, I spoke on how the Office was compiling a list of members who overpaid during the discount timeframe, to send a reimbursement check of the 2023 discount amount. It has since been decided that members who overpaid will have the credit remain on their account unless otherwise requested to the Office to receive the reimbursement check. If you have questions on whether or not you currently have a credit (or charge) on your account, please contact the office.

Pool Pass request forms are still being accepted, you may submit the completed form to <u>admin@lakeheritage.org</u>, or drop it off at the LH Office or dropboxes. The form can be found in various places including at the pool, the office, the gatehouse, on the Lake Heritage Official Facebook page and on the Lake Heritage Sharepoint Public Folder. Pool passes will be available to pick up at the Pool Shack once they have been printed. Pool pass printing will only occur on Fridays.

Now that the school year has ended and the pool season has begun, more members will be outside enjoying this nice weather. Please ensure the safety of all by adhering to the posted speed limits. Pedestrians should walk facing oncoming traffic. There have been numerous reports of members, children and adults, riding skateboards and scooters on Heritage Drive, as a reminder, skateboarding, roller blading and scooters are prohibited on Heritage Drive.

Our lake has been tested twice so far this season, both samples coming back with satisfactory results. At this time our lake is safe to be swimming and fishing in. As we continue into the warmer months I will provide more updates on the status and health of the lake.

The office will be closed on Monday, June 19th in observance of Juneteenth.

2023 Lake Heritage Pool Rules

The following policies are for the health and safety of all swimmers. Section 1:

Membership & Guests

1. The Lake Heritage Pool Facility is available for the enjoyment of all LHPOA dues paying members, their immediate family (defined in the Rules and Regulations as their spouses and members of their immediate family who live permanently, on a full-time basis at the same address as the dues paying member), and their guests (a fee is associated with a guest use of the pool).

2. Members acknowledge they are responsible for their conduct and the conduct of their guests and hereby hold harmless, indemnify, and agree to defend LHPOA, its officers, and employees from any and all claims, losses, damages, and expenses arising from the use of the pool facility and/or the actions of the employees whether or not those claims, losses, damages, and expenses arise from acts, negligence, or omissions of LHPOA. Members also acknowledge they have read, understand, and will comply with the Lake Heritage Pool Facility Rules.

3. All members must present their pool membership card to the attendant at the pool office whenever entering the pool area.

4. Guests: ALL guests must be registered and paid for upon entry.

a. Members must accompany and be responsible for the conduct of their guests at all times. There is a limit of 6 guests per household at any one time (with the exception of special events as described in Section 1, #5). b. Children under age 12 years of age do not have guest privileges with the exception of an accompanied adult/caregiver (age 16 or older and as described in Section 4, #1). c. Multiple guest passes and season passes are available for purchase at the pool office during business hours.

5. Members may sponsor special events at the pool by making prior arrangements with the Lake Office. Arrangements must be made at least two weeks in advance for groups greater than 6 to allow for proper preparation and staff coverage.

Section 2: Pool Operation

1. Pool hours – Full use of the Pool Facility is available from 10 am – 8 pm. All hours are subject to appropriate staffing.

2. Pool closure occurs with the loss of electricity, weather conditions that create an obstructed view of the pool bottom, thunder, lightning, and equipment malfunction that results in unsafe conditions at the discretion of the Pool Manager, Assistant Pool Manager, Head Lifeguard, or Community Manager.

3. Everyone must obey the pool staff at all times. The Pool Manager, Assistant Pool Manager, and lifeguards, at their sole discretion, are authorized to expel any individuals from the pool area who decline to obey instructions for the safety of others or for their behavior. Parents should inform their children of this authority.

4. In the event of an emergency, the lifeguard will sound 3 loud whistle blasts. Exit the pool immediately and listen for instructions.

Section 3: Health Considerations

1. Per CDC recommendations, shower before entering the pool, ESPECIALLY when coming to the pool after being in the lake.

2. Admission to the pool will be refused to anyone with open sores; eye, ear, or nose infections; or with bandages/adhesive tape on the body.

3. Spitting, spouting water from the mouth, and blowing the nose in the water are prohibited.

- 4. Report all injuries to a lifeguard for immediate first aid.
- 5. Clothing and diaper changing must be done in the locker rooms regardless of age.

6. To help reduce bacteria in the pool, children who are non-potty-trained must wear both a swim diaper and tight-fitting waterproof latex/rubber pants in the wading pool and the big pool.

7. Do not use items such as water shoes, flotation devices, life jackets, etc. that have been used outside of Lake Heritage pool facility to avoid cross contamination of bacteria.

Section 4: Age Requirements, Activities, Responsibilities, and Safety

1. PARENTS - WATCH YOUR CHILDREN. Children under age 12, regardless of swimming ability, must be accompanied by an adult or caregiver (age 16 or older) at all times. If the child cannot touch the bottom or swim 25 meters independently^{*}, the caregiver must be in the water and within arm's reach of the child at all times. *Children will be required to pass a swimming test to enter deep water independently. This test will consist of swimming one length of the pool.

2. ALL NON-SWIMMERS WHO CAN NOT TOUCH THE BOTTOM SHOULD WEAR A LIFEJACKET OR COAST GUARD APPROVED FLOATATION DEVICE.

Swimsuits with floatation inserts are also permitted.

a. All children using a lifejacket or Coast Guard floatation device must be directly supervised by an adult who is in the water and within arms reach at all times.

b. All children using a lifejacket or Coast Guard floatation device must always enter the water feet first

3. Proper bathing attire must be worn. Street clothes, compression shorts, and sports bras are not permitted.

4. The use of rafts, inner tubes, Swimmies[™], and floating boats are prohibited unless they are being used for a special event.

5. NO HYPERVENTILATING, EXTENDED UNDERWATER SWIMMING, OR EXTENDED BREATH HOLDING.

6. NO DIVING IN WATER THAT IS LESS THAN 6 FEET DEEP.

7. NO running, pushing, dunking, horseplay, wrestling, climbing on, or throwing people within the pool facility.

8. NO hanging or sitting on the ladders or steps. They must be kept clear except when in use for entering or exiting the pool.

9. Toy use in the main pool is at the discretion of the Pool Manager, Assistant Pool Manager, or the Head Lifeguard on duty.

10. Diving Board Rules:

- a. One person on the diving board at a time.
- b. Go straight off the end of the board.
- c. One bounce on the board per jump or dive.
- d. All dives must enter hands or feet first.
- e. Swim immediately to the closest ladder after going off the board.
- f. Wait until the previous person reaches the ladder before taking your turn.

10. Sliding Board Rules:

- a. Rider must be at least 48" tall.
- b. One person on the slide at a time.
- c. Rider must remain in the upright seated position at all times and enter the pool feet-first.
- d. Swim immediately away from the end of the slide upon entering the water.
- e. Wait until the previous person clears the area at the bottom of the slide before taking your turn.

11. Wading Pool Rules:

a. The wading pool is for young children under 48" tall and their parents or caregivers (age 16 or older).

b. Parental or caregiver supervision is required at all times.

12. Lap lanes are reserved for lap swimming only. Hanging on the lane lines or swimming through the lanes is prohibited. Section 5: General Restrictions

13. All food and drinks must be consumed on the grass or at any of the various tables available on the patios or in the pavilion.

14. The following are prohibited within the pool enclosure:

Chewing Gum Alcoholic Beverages Smoking or Vaping (including E-cigarettes) Abusive, foul or offensive language Inappropriate displays of affection

Glass of any sort = Pets


VISITOR POOL PASSES: Punch card pool passes for non-members are available for purchase at the pool gates: \$25 for a 10 punch pass


Help Support Local Scouts by Donating Paper Items Monthly

Tick Bite Prevention **T.I.C.K.**

Treat clothes and shoes with permethrin Apply permethrin insecticide to clothes, shoes, gear before engaging in outdoor activities.

Insect repellent

Apply an EPA approved insect repellent to your skin and over your clothes before engaging in outdoor activities.

Check for ticks

Check for ticks regularly while you are outside and conduct a thorough tick check when you come inside. Shower shortly after coming inside and place clothes in the dryer.

<u>Keep watch for signs and symptoms of</u> tickborne illnesses

Watch for the signs and symptoms described for each disease, especially in the summer when ticks are most active. Seek medical care if you develop symptoms related to tickborne diseases.

The Original Trail - Woodland Trail with The Loop Trail Segment



The Woodland Trail, which can be found from the ballfield parking lot opened in 2014. It takes you to Johnson Road and returns in about 3 / 4 of a mile. The additional segment named The Loop Trail joins back to the main trail. Both segments are mostly lined with small trees and marked with yellow blazes along the trails. There is one very short section of the Loop Trail that may require bicyclists to consider dismounting. There are spots on the Main Trail that hold wetness for a bit, but all-in-all it is a great place to enjoy nature.

The Second Trail – Shady Grove Trail

The Shady Grove Trail is a short 0.1 mile trail that runs along Heritage Drive from the CenturyLink building to the Shady Grove Pavilion parking lot. It's suitable as a great "beginner" hike for youngsters and a nice short walk in the woods for anyone wanting to connect more with nature.

Rachel Glover is no stranger to the Lake Heritage Pool. Her very first job at age 14 was working at the pool snack bar. When she turned 15, she got her Lifeguard Certification and that was her summer job through college years. During her last year, she became Lake Heritage Pool Manager. She also served as a lifeguard at a local campground. After college she left the lake but moved back 10 years ago. Now in 2023 she is back managing our pool. "I planned for this to be my full-time job," she said. "I will be doing my turn on the stands as well as doing management."

As of this writing, she has 14 Lifeguards lined up for the summer. They, with Rachel, make up the 2023 Pool Safety Team. Her staffing plan is to have a minimum of 4 Guards on at one time including herself. She plans to do in-service training with the Guards during the season which includes conducting drills of the Emergency Action Plan, Fitness Challenges, CPR Training and meeting with our local Emergency Medical Services.

Rachel has plans in the works for kids swim lessons and for much younger kids, a "Mommy/Daddy and Me," class. Watch the pool bulletin board and The Official Lake Heritage Facebook page for announcements.



Remembering Those Who Served Memorial Day Commemorative Event Sunday, May 28, 2023

The 2023 event was held Sunday, May 28 at Shady Grove.

Retired Colonel Bill Chantelau officiated the program. LH President Rich Dooley gave a welcome message. Keynote Speaker, Col Pete Lindquist USAF (Ret) delivered a very meaningful address. Invocation was given by Rev. Richard Ginnever, a LH Board Member. Marie Chantelau read "Just a Common Soldier" and rang the bell in remembrance of service individuals who have been lost since last year. Retired Sergeant First Class Steve Oakes spoke about LH Veteran's Support Program called The Boot. Taps was played by Retired Sergeant First Class Mitch Mummert. Posting of the Colors was provided by Gettysburg High School JROTC Color Guard.

The program included a three-fire cannon gun salute by 1st Maryland Artillery/Rigby's Battery Civil War reenacting soldiers since the 1990's. The 6-8 member unit follow strict and standard artillery procedures of the US Field Artillery Association and use a 1852 reproduction model 12 Pound Howitzer and limber.

Lake Heritage property resides on land that was occupied by and fought over by Civil War armies during the 1863 battle. May we who live on this land today never take freedom for granted nor forget those who served.
























Just A Common Soldier (A Soldier Died Today)

Saturday, June 3, 2023 7:00am-5:00pm

Contest Rules and Regulations:

1. DATE/TIME: Saturday, June 3, 2023, from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

2. Registration: No pre-registration necessary but entrants must read the rules before fishing.

3. Participation: Open to all Lake Heritage Property Owners. Owners' non-resident family and friends are welcome, BUT the lot owner must be present at the weigh-in. Lot owners are responsible for all their participants, whether family or guests. All Lake Heritage Property Owners' Association Rules and Regulations must be observed.

4. Weigh-in: 2:00PM until 5:00 PM at the Fishing Point (below the Community Center). You will need to present the lot owner's name, lot number and names of participants.

5. Weigh-in Procedure: Fish may be brought to be weighed in plastic buckets (preferred), plastic bags or coolers. Fish must be weighed at the area and time specified in paragraph 4. Fish to be disposed of do not have to be kept cold.

6. Acceptable Fish: NEW for 2023, Catfish and White Perch may be brought in for the weigh-in. Must be caught <u>during the hours of the tournament</u> only. Anyone bringing in fish caught outside the hours of the tournament hours will be <u>disqualified</u>.

7. Awards: Money (.50 cents per pound) and medals will be presented to children 16-under as you weigh-in.

8. Tackle Rules: All fish must be caught on conventional fishing tackle with hooks and live or artificial bait. You must supply your own bait. Fish may not be netted out of lake, unless first caught on a hook. The number of rods and hooks legal under PA laws are allowed.

9. Licensing: All adults and anyone 16 years or older must have a PA fishing license. Any boy or girl 15 years old or younger does not need a PA fishing license.

10. Penalties: Killing of wrong fish will be punishable by weight deduction before reward. The weight reduction is 8-lbs. for each wrong fish; cash equivalent of \$4.00. As stated above, fish not caught during the tournament hours should not be turned in. If you do, you will be disqualified.

11. Fish Retention: People desiring to keep the white perch to eat should keep them alive and cold or otherwise preserved. Bring them to weigh-in to be counted before gutting.

12. Littering: Do not litter with any material including bait containers and dead fish. Dead fish will be disposed of by tournament officials.

13. Fishing Areas: Everyone may fish from all public access areas around the lake as well as from LHPOA registered boats containing all safety requirements mandated by PA law. You may fish from private lots on the waterfront only with the permission of the owners.

14 Tournament End Time: The tournament is over at precisely 5:00 PM. You must be in line at the weigh-in station by 5:00PM or your fish will not be weighed.




