Hello, Lake Heritage!

The 2023/2024 Fiscal Year Dues and Assesments are now past due with a 15% penalty if payment has not already been received. The office is currently working on compiling a list of members who will be receiving a discount refund for making a full payment during the discount time frame. These members should expect a check in the amount overpaid to be sent in the mail. If you have questions regarding your 2023 Member Dues, please call the office.

Mark your calendars! The 2023 Pool Season begins Saturday, May 27th! We are excited for another fun filled year in the sun and are still accepting applications for lifeguards! To obtain a 2023 Pool Pass, you may submit the completed form to admin@lakeheritage.org, or drop it off at the LH Office or dropboxes. Pool passes will be available to pick up at the Pool Shack on opening day or your first visit at the pool.

Mowing season is upon us! Please be mindful and courteous when mowing your grass; be sure to keep it out of the lake and swales and off the roads!

Brush Drop off has begun and will continue to occur twice a month most months until November. Please keep in mind when bringing brush that limbs should not exceed 3 inches in diameter, leaves, grass and garden clippings, roots, plywood/lumber is not accepted. There is also a volunteer Brush Pick Up being coordinated for members unable to haul their own brush. Boating season is almost here! I would like to go over some things to keep in mind when out on the lake:

- Do: Travel in a counterclockwise direction
Respect the “No Wake Zones”
Have a competent spotter who is not operating the boat when pulling or towing anyone
Have a PFD (Lifejacket) for each individual on the boat, specific to each individual
Have properly functioning running lights when on the lake after sunset
- Do Not: Stand or sit on the sides or back of watercrafts in motion
Go at fast speeds after sunset
Propel non-powered watercraft against traffic outside of No Wake Zones
Swim beyond the No Wake Buoys

To initiate an inspection for a new boat, call the office to find out what information is required to be provided, and to schedule a time for Security to come take a look at your watercraft. Quarantine Inspections may be initiated at the Security Gatehouse. Members must obtain an orange quarantine slip and begin a 7 day quarantine when bringing watercraft back into Lake Heritage from visiting outside bodies of waters.

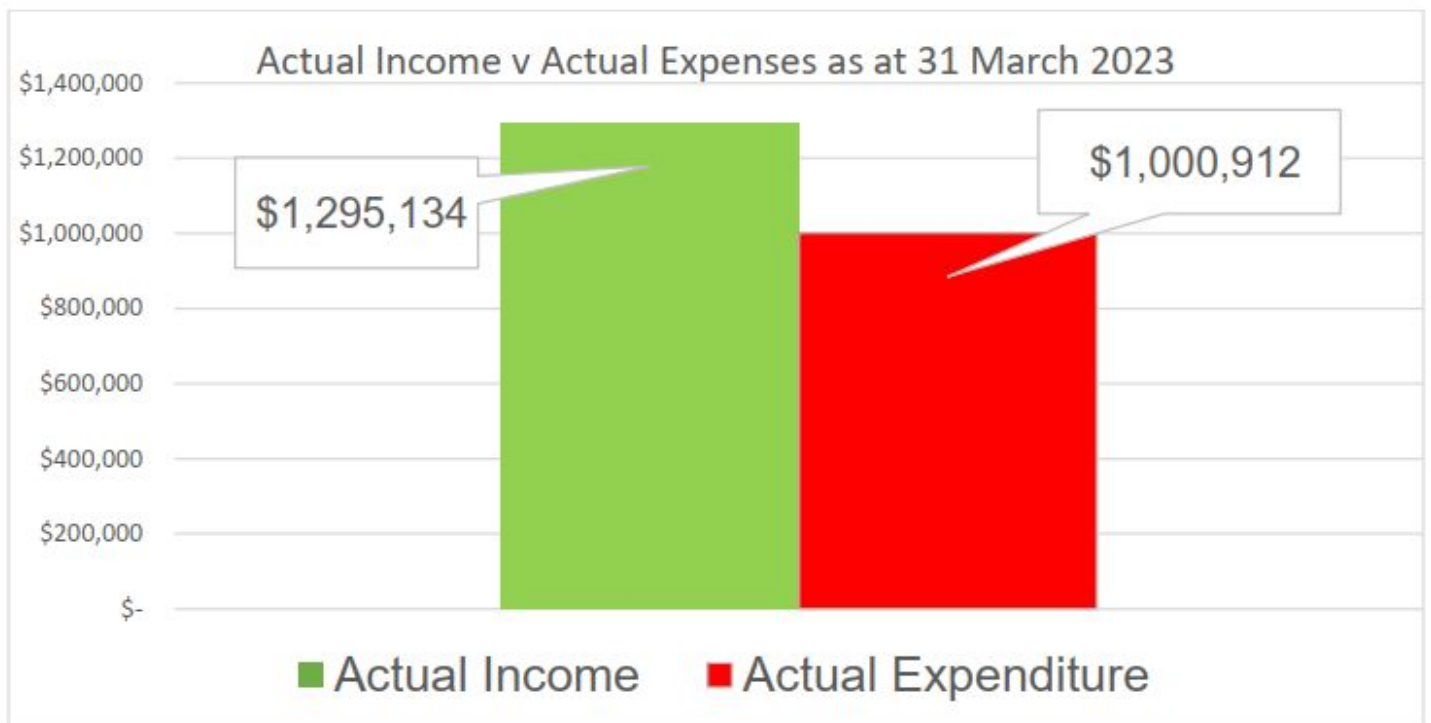
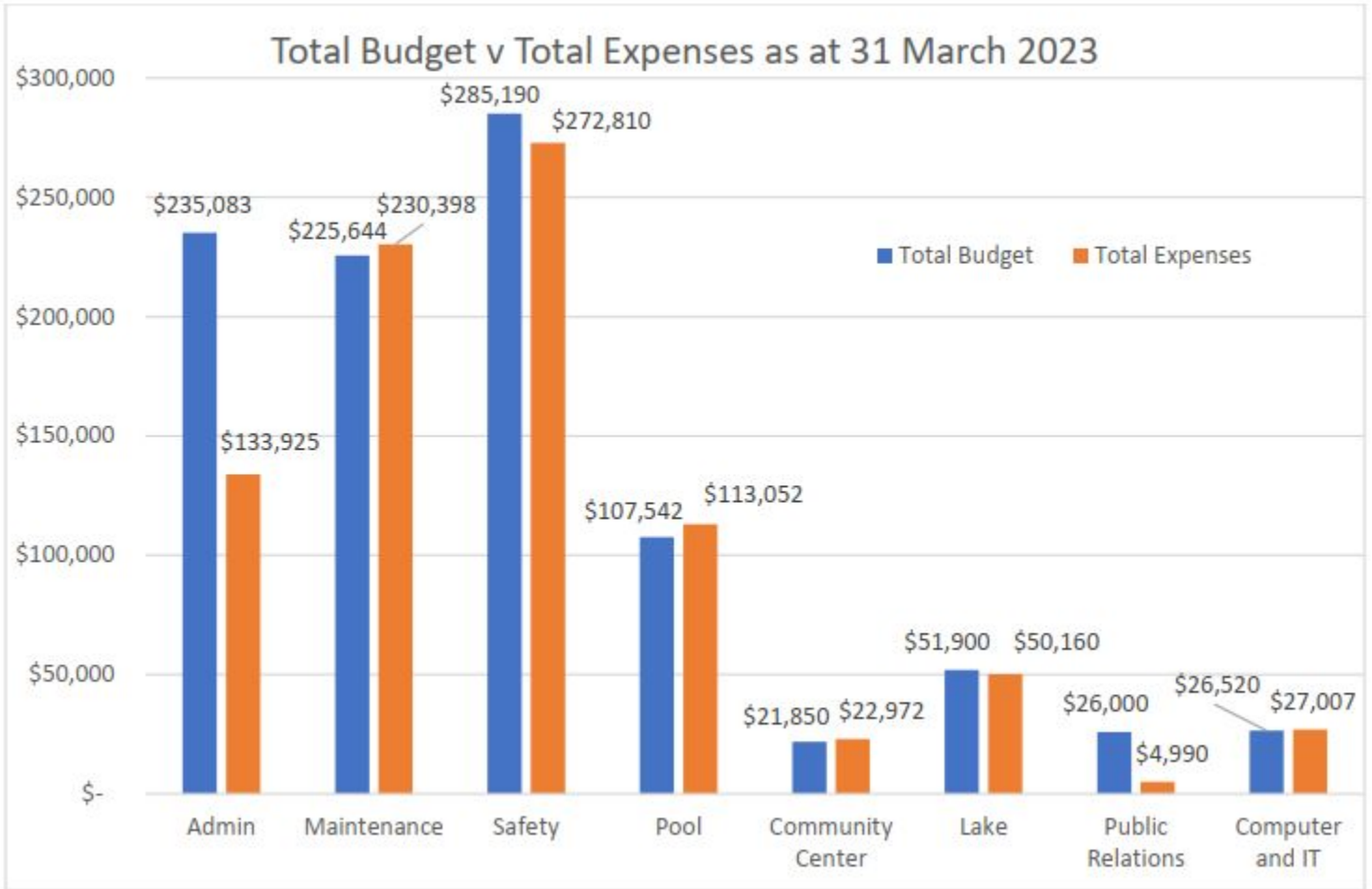
Lot Numbers should be listed along with current (light blue) LHPOA watercraft stickers on both sides of watercrafts. In addition to labeling watercrafts, Lakefront owners should ensure that their docks have lot numbers listed and are easily visible by using numbers no less than 3 inches in height.

New LHPOA President Rich Dooley discussed the changes he hopes to make in the coming year. Those include:

1. Offer strong support to the various clubs and event organizers that volunteer time to bring the community together.
2. Ensure that Board Meetings are as concise as possible and stay on topic, following Robert's Rules, to respect the Board and Membership's time.
3. Transparency and Openness. Informing the members why the Board makes the decisions that they do while also allowing the members to have access to view discussions the Board has outside of meetings. (*This excludes topics of Confidential and Personnel matters).
4. Minimize the communication gap between the Board and Members by updating the technology that is currently being used.

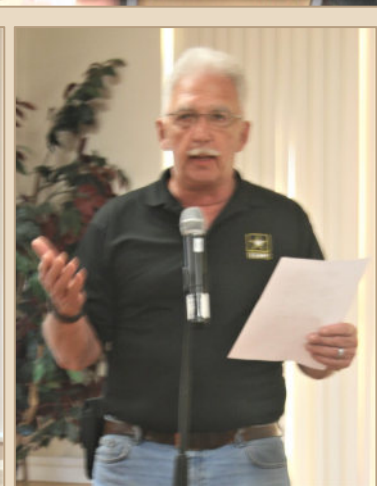
Part of the Agenda was the presentation of Community Service Awards to 14 members who went "above and beyond" to serve the community. Recipients were Dawn Levickas for her efforts as our newsletter editor; Doug Rudisill for his persistence in raising questions on community policies and finances; Patricia and Thomas Redenbach for organizing the community brush pick up and to Scott Zimmerer and Ernie Clevenger for assisting in this project; Courtney Pratt and Dale "Farmer" Bodkins of our Maintenance Staff also were awarded for assistance in the brush pick up project. John Scherer was awarded for conducting informational session on lake health; Allison Crowell for creation of the Lake Heritage Childrens Garden as well as educating our children about nature. Blair Thomas for coming out of retirement to volunteer as chief of Security. Dan Tapper was also recognized for assisting the security staff. Dave Deihl for running our Fun and Fitness program since 2009. Samantha Richards was awarded for providing creative assistance with other clubs and leading our seasonal decorating efforts. Tanya Keller and Mike Waller were both awarded for their tireless work to keep Lake Heritage operating since late 2021 when our entire office staff quit. They also trained two new community managers, ran the office and handling our finances. We all owe them our gratitude for the number of hours they spent keeping our community operating without any compensation.

As in all annual membership meetings there were the annual reports from our committees and clubs. The surprise from this was the announcement from Donna Spicer that the Performing Arts Club has dissolved. Their entertainment events will be missed by many of us.

As mentioned earlier this was the first board meeting since February, there was business to be conducted. Seven motions were made, discussed and approved. The final business

was announcing that a search will be conducted to fill the board vacancy created by the resignation of Tanya Keller. It has since been announced that Interested members in good standing should submit application materials by May 5th.

LH Garden Club Volunteers Beautify Downtown Gettysburg Year Round

Lake Heritage residents who are volunteer members of the Gettysburg Garden Club are Betsy Meyer, Connie Wehler, Cindy Spinelli, and Pat Thorsen. Connie and Pat are both on the Board of the Club.

Our first annual activity is the Spring Plant Sale which will be held at the Gettysburg Fire Hall on Saturday, May 20th from 9am until 2pm. Early in the spring Club Members divide their perennials, pot them, and then offer them for sale. The plants that flourish in the sun are grouped together, those that require more shade are also grouped together. Club members are there to answer questions about the plants. Betsy Meyer is the Club member who has organized and overseen this project for several years.

The Garden Club has a Christmas Holiday Greens and Gourmet Gift Sale which is held the first Saturday in December at the Fire Hall. Featured are greens which we gather or are donated by the community. With these we create beautiful arrangements and wreaths sold at the Greens Sale. Club members also prepare all sorts of cookies and other treats that are sold too.

Both fundraisers provide the Club with the funds used to give scholarships to students who are pursuing higher education in the fields of horticulture, landscape design, forestry, conservation, or similar areas of study. Generally, four scholarships are awarded each year.

The Club creates and maintains the beautiful garden beds in the center of downtown Lincoln Square each year. Lincoln Square starts with the tulips in the spring, then changes to a patriotic red, white, and blue floral display. In May you can see the Club members plant the summer annuals early one May morning. The Square is weeded all summer long by Club members wearing bright pink T-shirts to keep up their beautiful appearance. The hanging baskets and eight planters around the Square continue the patriotic color theme. In the winter, the Club members install a winter display in the eight planters. In March that display is replaced with pansies for the Spring.

The Garden Club gives thanks to and enjoys partnering with the Borough of Gettysburg for the watering of the Gardens and to Musselman's Nursery which is the source of the beautiful flowers each year. Through the Adams County Community Foundation's Giving Spree held yearly in November the community shows its support of the Downtown Flower Project and all that the Garden Club does to bring beauty to our downtown all year long.

Lake Heritage Spring Birding Report

Callan Murphy and his wife, Cristal, are residents of Lake Heritage. Callan is an avid birder who has been observing the birds at Lake Heritage for several years. Here he shares his birding experience at the Lake and introduces eBird, a vital tool for modern birding.

Spring bird migration in the northeastern United States has to be one of the great avian spectacles on the planet. The eye-catching colors, the symphony of birdsong, the abundance and variety of species during the heart of spring are what many birders most look forward to each year.

Here at Lake Heritage, we have a great opportunity to witness this natural spectacle. Since large bodies of water are scarce in the immediate area, many species take advantage of this resource, especially during the colder months and during migration. In the winter, particularly cold winters when pond and creek surfaces freeze, there will be a variety of ducks, geese and other water birds that take refuge on our lake. The Canada Goose, Mallard, Bufflehead, Ring-necked duck, Hooded Merganser, Common Merganser, and Ruddy Duck are some of the regularly seen species during the winter months. In early-to-mid-spring we will often see visits from the Double-crested Cormorant, Common Loon, Ring-billed Gull, Bonapartes Gull, Tundra Swan, Osprey, and Caspian Tern. One of my favorites to see in the spring is the Spotted Sandpiper. Their constant tail-bobbing and scrambling about searching for invertebrates is always a treat to watch!

To catch any of these birds in action, it helps to have a good pair of binoculars or a spotting scope. I find the best spots to view birds on the lake are from along the dam or at The Point beyond the playground and ball courts. To see songbirds, the Woodland Trail that runs from the Dog Park to Johnson Drive, is a great place to go. I've observed a few different warbler species there such as Nother Parula, Black-throated Blue Warbler, and Ovenbird.

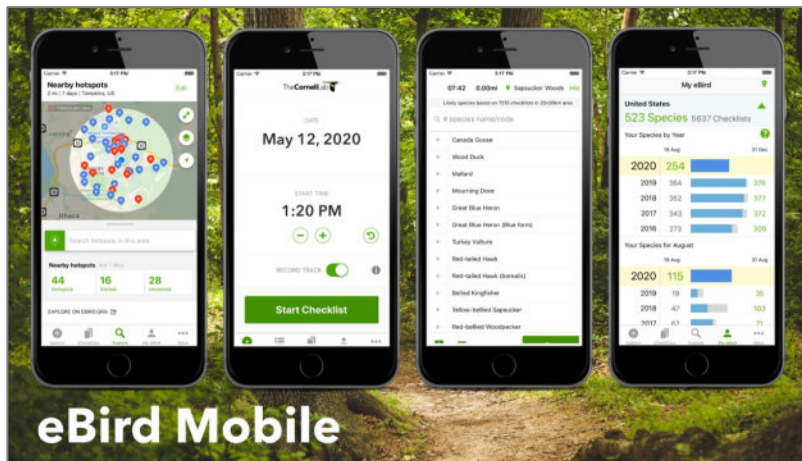
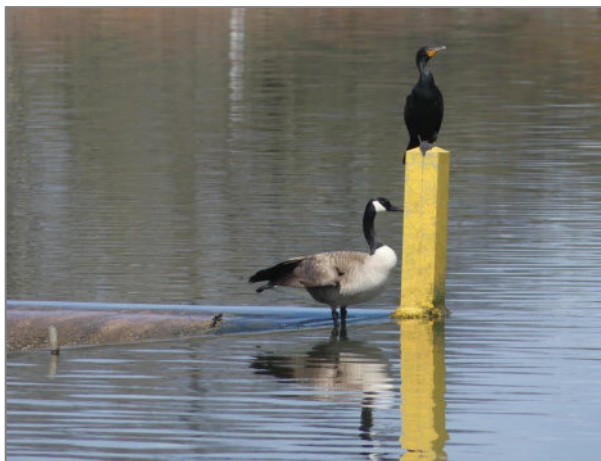
While you're out looking for birds this spring, perhaps you'd like to do a little citizen science. If you're not familiar with the platform Audubon eBird, allow me to provide an introduction: eBird is an online database dedicated to the study of birds. It's run by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and powered by citizen science. Birders from all over the world help contribute to this now massive platform by simply recording and submitting their bird sightings. In return we are all rewarded with a wonderful resource that improves our birding experience.

How can you get involved? First, visit ebird.org and create a Cornell Lab account. From there you can make an eBird profile to get started recording your bird sightings. The website allows you to create and submit bird checklists online, or you can download the eBird app and submit the data in real-time directly from your phone. The app is streamlined and should be easy to learn, however if you prefer birding with a good ole' pencil and notebook, you can always submit your data at a later time on the website or through the app. You can even upload photos and audio to enrich your checklists for later viewing online. All media submitted on eBird goes into the Macaulay Library, an enormous scientific archive available to all eBird users.

Each year in May, eBird hosts a worldwide event called Global Big Day. This is a day where birders try to find as many bird species as possible within a 24-hour period. My personal record is 103 species, and some have logged many more than that. It's a grind going out in the field for the entire day, but it's a lot of fun! You don't have to spend the entire day birding though; even going out for five- or ten-minutes counts. If you haven't used eBird before, it could be a great time to start. The worldwide participation during this event provides a great snapshot of avian populations across the globe.

This year Global Big Day is on Saturday May 13th.

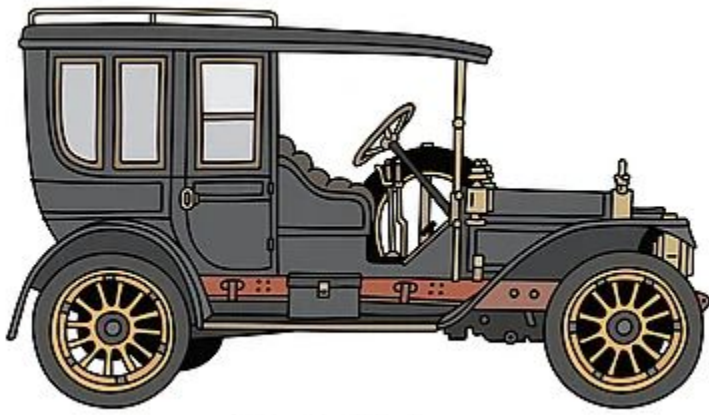

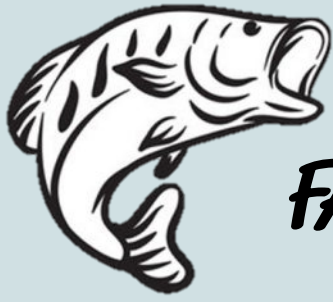

LAKE HERITAGE 22nd EMERSON-GREENHOLT FAMILY FISHING MARATHON



Saturday, June 3, 2023
7:00am - 5:00pm

Contest Rules and Regulations:

1. **DATE/TIME:** Saturday, June 3, 2023, from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
2. **Registration:** No pre-registration necessary but entrants must read the rules before fishing.
3. **Participation:** Open to all Lake Heritage Property Owners. Owners' non-resident family and friends are welcome, BUT the lot owner must be present at the weigh-in. Lot owners are responsible for all their participants, whether family or guests. All Lake Heritage Property Owners' Association Rules and Regulations must be observed.
4. **Weigh-in:** 2:00PM until 5:00 PM at the Fishing Point (below the Community Center). You will need to present the lot owner's name, lot number and names of participants.
5. **Weigh-in Procedure:** Fish may be brought to be weighed in plastic buckets (preferred), plastic bags or coolers. Fish must be weighed at the area and time specified in paragraph 4. Fish to be disposed of do not have to be kept cold.
6. **Acceptable Fish:** NEW for 2023, Catfish and White Perch may be brought in for the weigh-in. Must be caught during the hours of the tournament only. Anyone bringing in fish caught outside the hours of the tournament hours will be disqualified.
7. **Awards:** Money (.50 cents per pound) and medals will be presented to children 16-under as you weigh-in.
8. **Tackle Rules:** All fish must be caught on conventional fishing tackle with hooks and live or artificial bait. You must supply your own bait. Fish may not be netted out of lake, unless first caught on a hook. The number of rods and hooks legal under PA laws are allowed.
9. **Licensing:** All adults and anyone 16 years or older must have a PA fishing license. Any boy or girl 15 years old or younger does not need a PA fishing license.
10. **Penalties:** Killing of wrong fish will be punishable by weight deduction before reward. The weight reduction is 8-lbs. for each wrong fish; cash equivalent of \$4.00. As stated above, fish not caught during the tournament hours should not be turned in. If you do, you will be disqualified.
11. **Fish Retention:** People desiring to keep the white perch to eat should keep them alive and cold or otherwise preserved. Bring them to weigh-in to be counted before gutting.
12. **Littering:** Do not litter with any material including bait containers and dead fish. Dead fish will be disposed of by tournament officials.
13. **Fishing Areas:** Everyone may fish from all public access areas around the lake as well as from LHPOA registered boats containing all safety requirements mandated by PA law. You may fish from private lots on the waterfront only with the permission of the owners.
14. **Tournament End Time:** The tournament is over at precisely 5:00 PM. You must be in line at the weigh-in station by 5:00PM or your fish will not be weighed.
