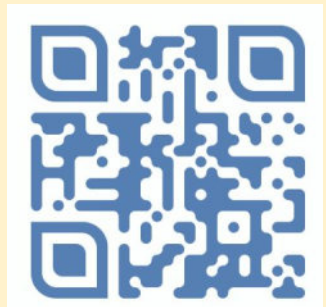

Electronic Polling Instructions:

On Tuesday October 10 we will be sending out a poll to each member. This poll will be sent as an email to the primary email address listed in the member's file, and as a text message to the primary phone number listed in the member's file. The poll will be active for one month. The email or text message will include a link that you can follow right from your computer or phone to fill out the poll! The email will come from:

Lake Heritage Property Owners Association <invitations@mail.electionbuddy.com>

Please add this email address to your trusted emails and check your SPAM box after Tuesday.

After the first week, a paper version of the poll will be sent out to members who have not yet voted via an electronic link.

The paper version of the poll can be mailed back to the office, dropped off at the office, or dropped in the drop box at either the office or the guardhouse. This paper version of the poll will also include a QR code at which you can point your phone's camera to be given a link to submit your answers.

Both the electronic poll and the paper poll contain a special code to ensure each member/lot only votes once. There are eight (8) questions in the poll. You may answer all or only some of the questions, but we would appreciate it if you answered them all! If you choose not to answer a question, simply select the "Abstain" option for that question. There are two questions that you must answer, and I'll explain them below. The questions in the poll are:

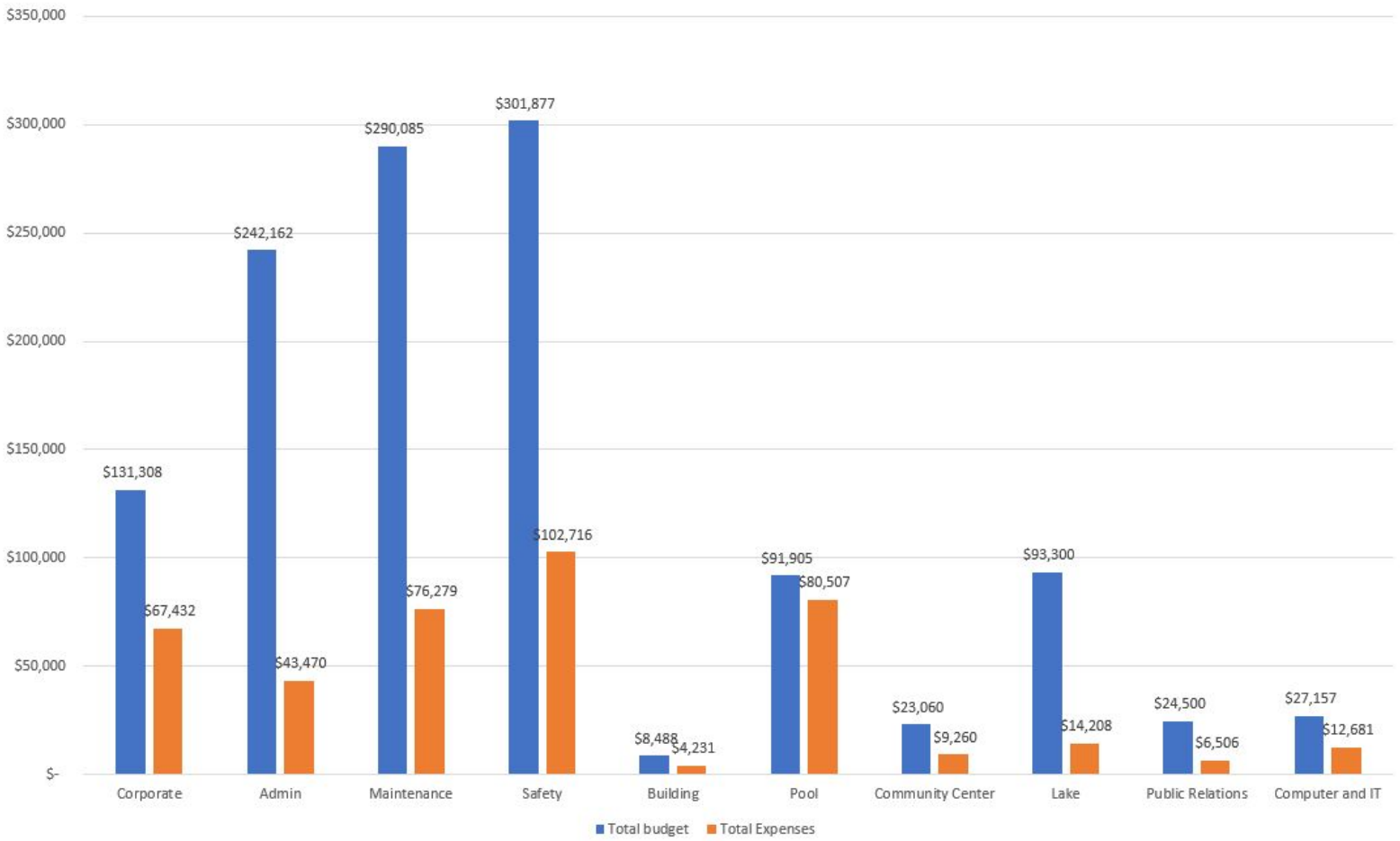
1. **Select your favorite gas stations.** This question is simply meant to test some aspects of this system for when we use it during an election. You can select one to three of the provided options or you can abstain.
2. **Select The Board priorities that are most important to you.** You can select one to three options or you can abstain.
3. **How satisfied are you with the direction The Board is headed this year?** You can select one answer or abstain.
4. **How do you get your information from The Association?** You MUST select two choices OR abstain.
5. **Opt-In for electronic voting.** Our current election system is very expensive, horrible for the environment, and not very accurate. PA state law is now giving us the option to let members opt-in to ONLY get their election ballots and notifications via email/text. If you select "OPT-IN" The Association will no longer send you paper ballots. They will ONLY come to you by email or text.
By selecting "I do NOT opt-in" you will continue to receive paper ballots during each election if you do not vote electronically.
You cannot abstain from this question because an abstention would be the same as selecting "I do NOT opt-in"
6. **Primary Email Address.** This is your chance to tell us at which email address you would prefer to receive your future ballots. It can always be changed through the office later.
7. **Primary Text Ready Phone Number.** This is your chance to tell us at which phone number you would prefer to receive your future ballots. It can always be changed through the office later.
8. **Signature.** All ballots must be signed in order to be counted, so you cannot abstain from this question. If responding electronically, you will type your full name in the space provided.

Make sure to click SUBMIT after selecting your answers on the electronic poll **AND confirm your responses on the following page!**

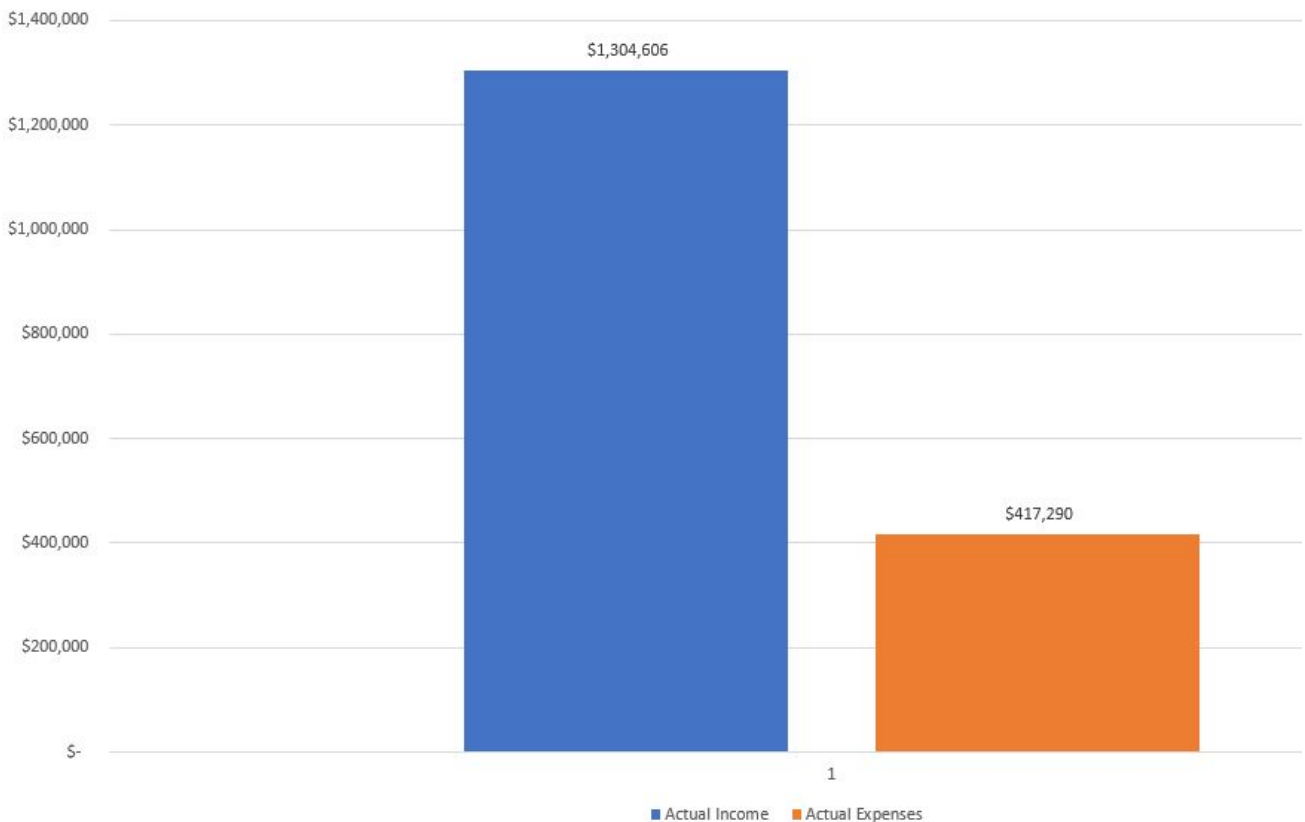

Operations Report

September was a productive month for the Maintenance staff and the community. It began with the Dam being mowed to look great for an exciting Regatta weekend. We hired another Full time member- Izicual Nipassa- so make sure to welcome him to the team as you see him around working hard. We began the dog park beautification and will continue to work on this area. After a stellar pool season by Rachel and her staff, we had the Pool People out for the drawdown of the Pool. In addition, we filled the holes in around the pillars at the entrance to the pool. Speaking of the pool, a new water element was put in so all the showers hot water will be working next season, and new shower heads were installed. Rec area 352 had 4 trees that needed to be taken down due to rot. We have all the lights at the front entrance, Shady Grove, and the Community Center working as well. In addition, we identified and re-labeled all the electrical boxes that we use to ensure safety and ease in identifying power sources. All of this was done in addition to mowing and trimming our Rec areas in the Community.

In October we will see the seasons begin to change and new tasks arise. We will again be conducting leaf removal for the Community beginning Oct 17th. This will be done every other week and a list of dates and which roads will be serviced will be supplied. HVAC repair will be occurring in the Small room of the Community Center. The Shady Grove playground equipment will be re-sealed and re-oiled. The Guardhouse will have the exterior power washed. The lights at the main entrance will be cleaned, with the incoming lights switched out to match the outgoing lights. In addition, as the lake begins drawdown we will begin to plan to remove debris from the coves in the upcoming months.

Access and Patrol has been busy as well. We have been working to make all reports digital and added a tablet to the Patrol vehicle so reports can be written, submitted, and stored more effectively. The team has done a great job at conducting radar checks. Thank you to those Community members who have granted access to their driveways for Patrol. We encourage, especially as the time changes and it gets darker earlier to drive the speed limit and look out for all the walkers and bikers in the Community. One of our team members has gone out on a temporary leave, and all the other Access and Patrol team members have rallied behind her to ensure all shifts are covered as we wait for a speedy recovery. The team would like to remind members to stop at the stop sign past the window. This ensures that no other cars are coming from other directions, and allows the team time to write down the license plate number.

The Maintenance team, with the addition of Izicual, are excited to take on these tasks and continue to move forward with whatever work and projects present themselves to make Lake Heritage the best place to live. Access and Patrol will continue to work hard at making our Community safe at all times.

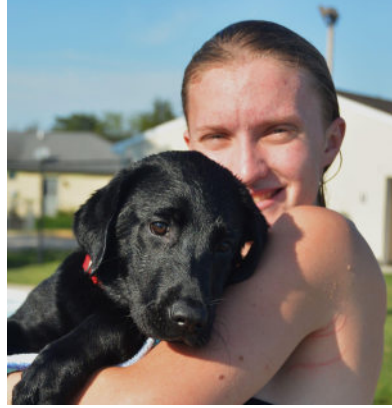

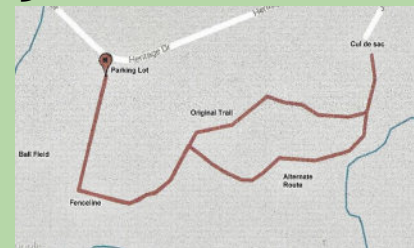

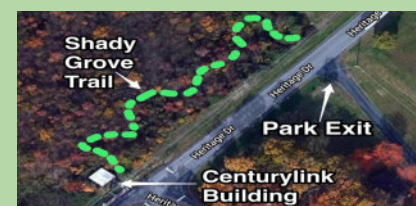
The Original Woodland Trail with The Loop Trail Segment

Lake Heritage Rules for Burning Debris

According to Lake Heritage Land Use Permit Regulations and Structure Code, Section 9, article 5 pertaining to small fires, the rule is...

Small Fires used for burning brush, wood and paper cannot be left unattended at any time. The contractor and/or property owner must notify Adams County Control of his or her intentions to burn this material.

Debris never allowed to be burned:

- Styrofoam in any form
- Plastic sheathing, bags, or forms
- Cardboard or any form of paperboard
- Construction materials
- Trees, large logs, or large quantity of plant material



For the sake and health of your family, neighbors, and wildlife, be respectful of these rules. Contact the office if you have questions.

After dinner, Club President Matt Verdirame started the business meeting. He asked for volunteers to help with hosting duties. Hosting a meeting is not a significant commitment of time but helps create an enjoyable atmosphere for each Club gathering. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to donate \$1,000.00 to the Fish Stocking fund. The fish survey is scheduled for this fall. At this time, we think that largemouth bass will be stocked prior to winter. The President gave an update on the lake condition and said overall the water is in good condition. A little spot treatment was done during the past few weeks. Ila Verdirame gave an update on the paper recycling that has been held by the Boy Scouts, saying the last one will be September 15. The reason they are discontinuing is that the amount of money they are getting does not justify the work involved.

Ernie Clevinger, the treasurer, provided the financial status of the club. The balance as of the end of August was \$8,095.38 – of which \$1,644.95 is earmarked for supporting the Veterans Initiative. This leaves \$6,450.43 available for Club initiatives. The Treasurer's report was approved by the members. Ernie stated that as of the end of August, the club has met the budgeted goal of 90 paid members for 2023. It is not too late to pay your 2023 dues. You can drop off a check at the office or contact Ernie Clevinger - 240-273-8608. He will start collecting dues for 2024 at the next meeting.

The Secretary's report of the August 11th meeting was approved by the members, and those with September birthdays and anniversaries were celebrated.

The next Fishing Club meeting is Friday, October 13, 2023. The hosts will be the Club Officers. The theme will be celebrating Columbus Day and the menu for the dinner will be Italian.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 pm.
