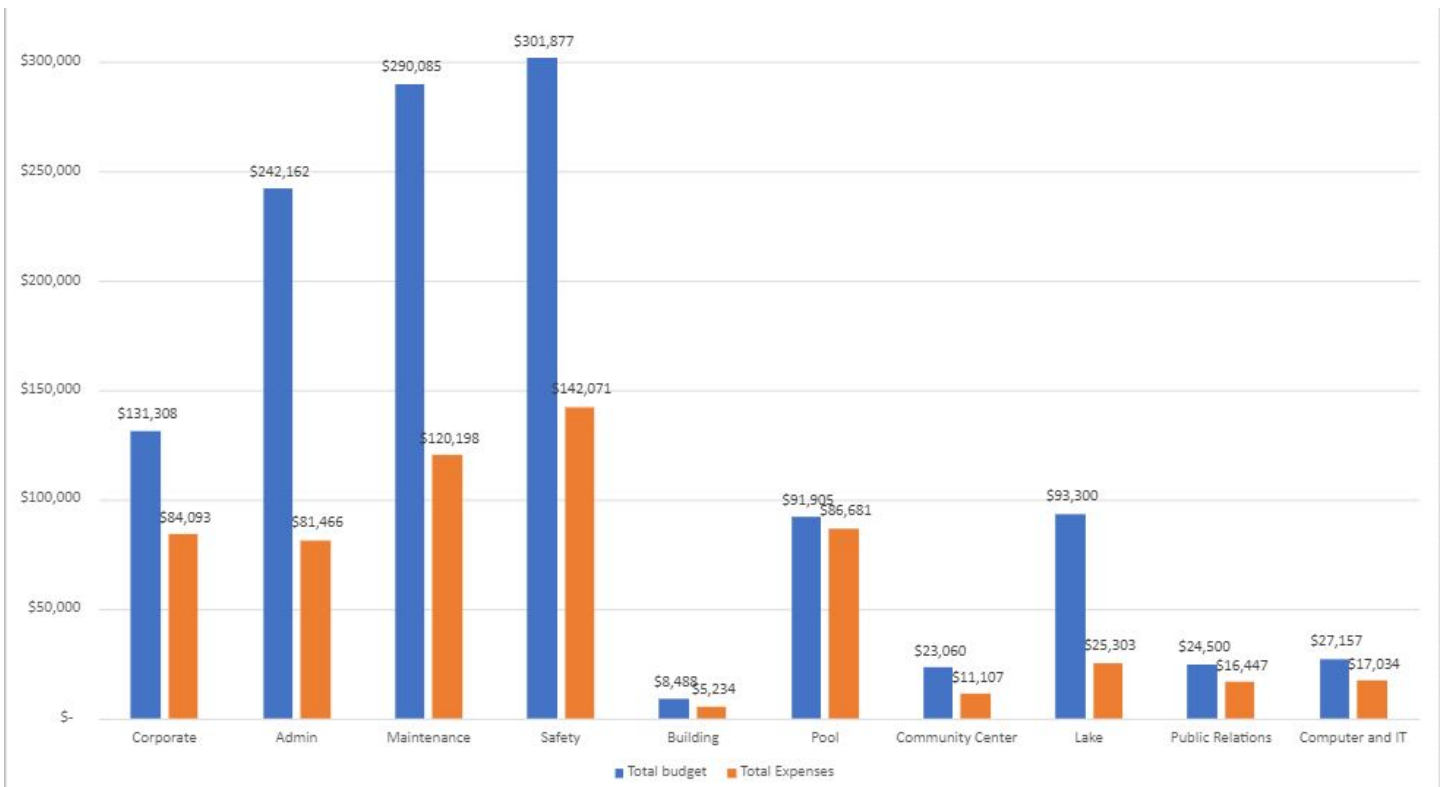
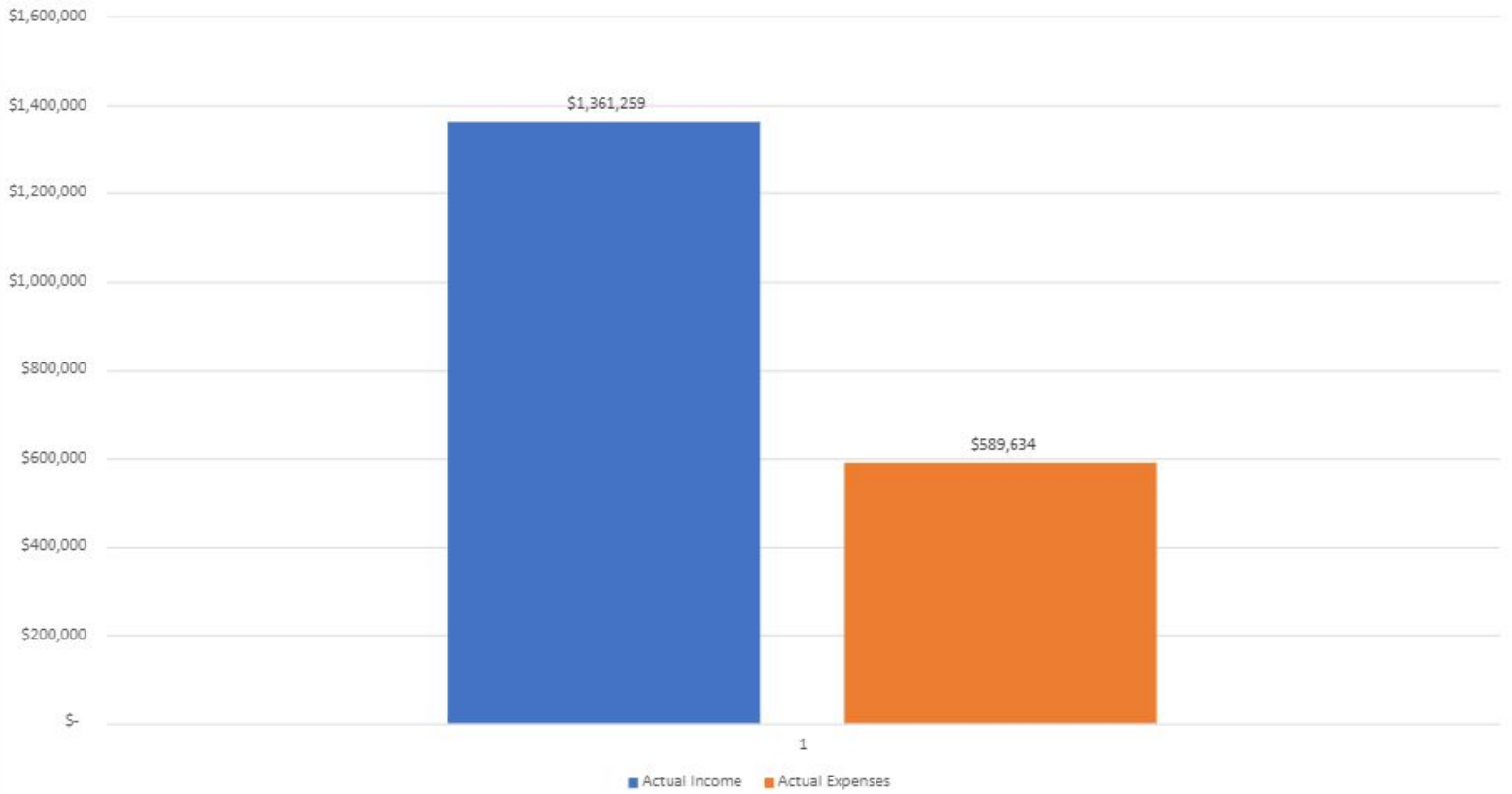

Lake Heritage Helps to Support

Toys for Tots Program

Nationally, the Toys for Tots program began in 1947 as the brainchild of Marine Corps Reserve Major Bill Hendricks. Actually, it was his wife, Diane, who was the real inspiration. She had a few handcrafted dolls and asked Bill to deliver them to an agency that supported children in need.

When Bill reported back to his wife that he could not find such an organization, she instructed him to "start one". Major Hendricks and the Marines in his reserve unit in LA did that. They collected and distributed 5,000 toys in 1947. The program grew from that single act of kindness.

Presently, the Marine Toys for Tots Program distributes an average of 18 million toys to 7 million less fortunate children annually.

The collection for Toys for Tots began here in our Lake Heritage Community in the 1980s. Each year two boxes are placed in the Community Center. Each box holds between 50-75 toys. The majority of these toys stay within Adams County, but depending on need they can be sent to other counties within Pennsylvania.

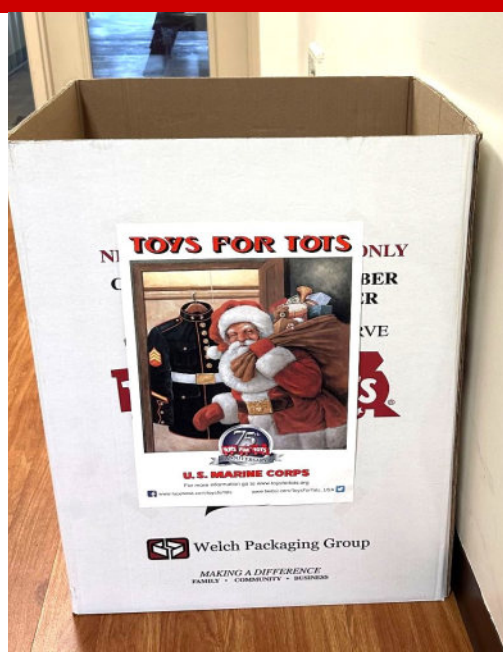

The Gettysburg Soup Kitchen – Fulfilling Community Needs Year Round

The Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen (GCSK) is fortunate to have three members of our community presently serving on its Board. Over the years we have had Lake Heritage neighbors who have also served on the Board, and we have had those who have volunteered at the Soup Kitchen. We also have many in our community whose churches have greatly helped us over the years... and neighbors who have individually assisted us financially.

Due to the increased number of guests, and limited indoor space, we have continued to serve healthy warm meals on a take-out basis only. This allows us to serve an ever-increasing number of folks. This also means that volunteer positions for serving indoors are very limited. A survey of our guests showed that they preferred taking their meals home with them, rather than sitting inside (especially since many of them have limited medical support... so sitting in an enclosed space with other guests, who may be sick and coughing, was not something they looked forward to).

This year has been a challenging year for The GCSK. Some of our guests have lost Medicaid and food stamps. As we all have experienced this year, the incredible cost of food, the increase in rent and the lack of housing has all added to the stress many of our guests feel. This led to ever increasing number of guests. Fortunately, The Soup Kitchen has been able to continue feeding those in need.

The Soup Kitchen Board would welcome any Lake Heritage folks who would like to help us meet this mission. TV and movies show many kind-hearted people going to soup kitchens and food banks, around the holiday season, to serve meals to those in need. Due to our efficient, and preferred take-home process, our greatest need continues to be financial support and donated food.

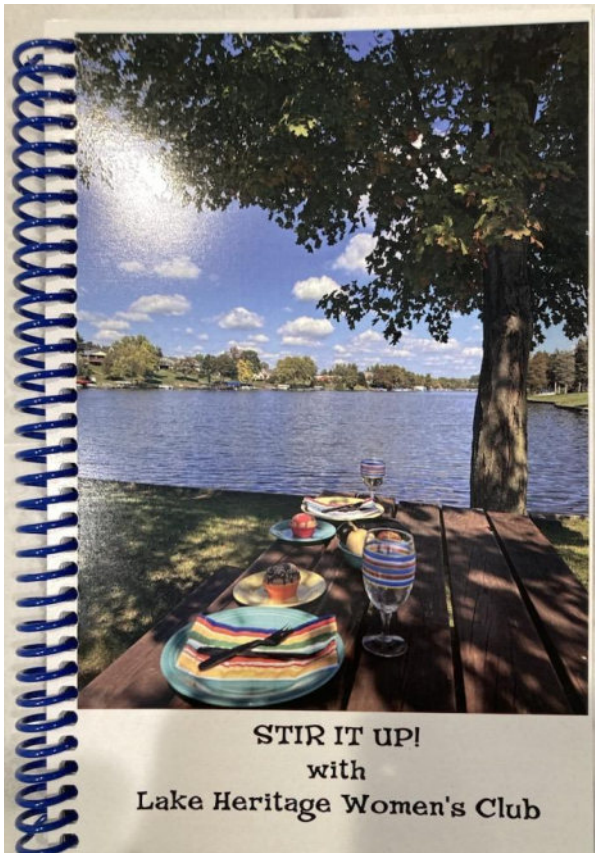

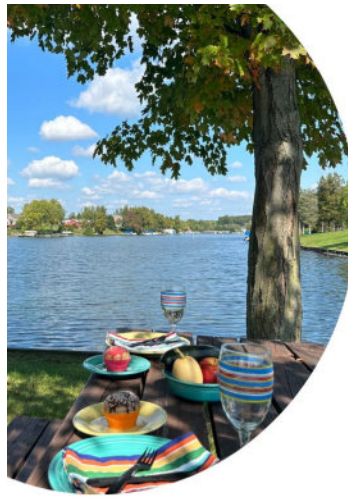

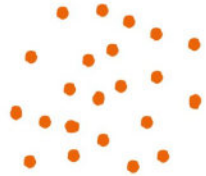

We are grateful for the tenacious volunteers who continue to strive for a clean and beautiful Pennsylvania.

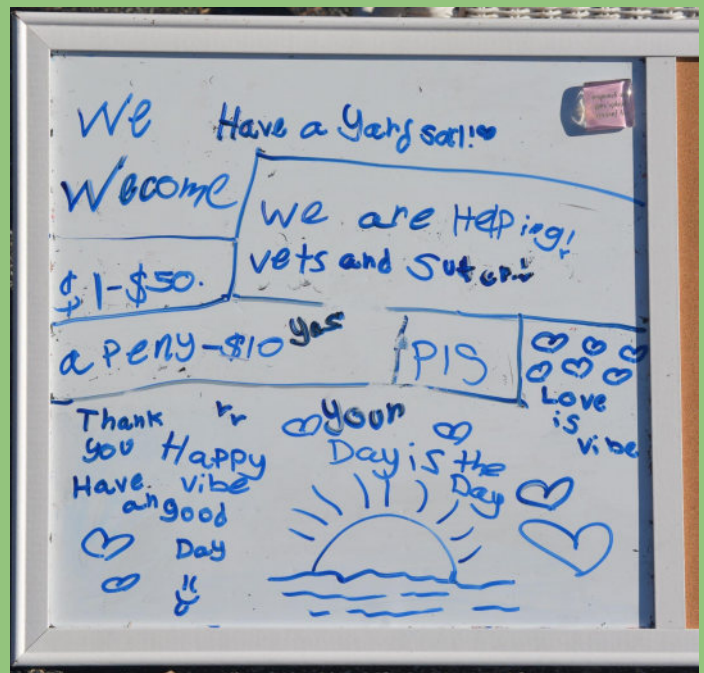

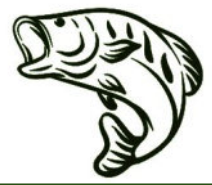

While turkey was the centerpiece of the potluck, there were too many traditional Thanksgiving dishes and desserts to list. Suffice it to say it was a wonderful dinner experience. President Steve Oakes ran the business meeting. His first action was to orchestrate a photo of all the veterans in attendance. On behalf of the Club's Members, Steve Oakes expressed appreciation for Scotty's many years of assistance. (2) Ernie noted the lake's drawdown begins 20 November and that the lake appears to be in great shape. (3) Beth Bauer reminded all that the Family Dinner and Bingo Night is Friday, February 23, 2024. She will be engaging volunteers soon on soups and again asked all to begin identifying or purchasing prizes.
