In upcoming weeks you will all be receiving your 2024/2025 Fiscal Year Dues and Assessment letters. Please read your statement letter carefully this year as there *may* be clarifications on the amount owed (based on your current homeowner ledger balance). As always, any membership dues accepted before April 1st shall be granted a 3% discount. Dues and Assessments should be paid by April 30th to avoid a 15% penalty imposed after May 1st.

In addition with the Dues and Assessments statement, a Member Information form will be included in the packet. It will be prefilled with current Homeowner Information. If you would like to make adjustments to the information listed, please make the corrections and return the form to the Office via Mail, Drop Boxes or stopping during operational hours.

24/25 FY Stickers will be available mid February. A copy of registrations for all vehicles and any powered watercrafts are needed when issuing stickers. Digital registrations may be sent in an email to the admin@lakeheritage.org email, please include your Name and Lot Number and whether or not you will be stopping in to pick up your stickers or if you'd like them mailed out.

Operations Report

December saw the end of the seasonal leaf removal service. This was the 2nd year of this process for the Lake. The team continued to work hard to try to accommodate all the piles of leaves, weather issues, and mechanical issues as they appeared throughout the season. Just as fine tuning the machine is an ongoing project that is flexible, so too is the removal schedule. Now that we have 2 years of data, we will continue to try to make the process as efficient as possible for next season based on feedback that we have received. Thank you to everyone who participated, gave feedback, and suggestions.

The Pirate Ship has returned to Shady Grove!! Our new Pirate Ship arrived in December. While being very similar to the old, it has a few new additions, such as a cargo net and canopy cover for kids to enjoy. While it was sad to not have the Ship for awhile, we hope that with proper maintenance the current Pirate Ship will last a long time and provide just as many happy memories and moments as the previous ship.

In last month's newsletter I mentioned that with the holidays approaching and more guests and deliveries occurring to please be patient at the front gate should slight back ups and wait times occur. Thank you to all members for their kindness to our Access and Patrol staff during this month, both with your patience and all the generous gifts and goodies they received.

In researching possible improvements to the front gate, a traffic study was conducted during first and second shift on Tue 12/11, Thur 12/14, and Sat 12/16, and the results were very interesting and informative as to how many cars per hour come through!

The chart below is broken down by hour, the type of vehicle (ie member/ guest, etc), and shows the average number of cars per minute that come into the community.

Lake Heritage Property Owners Association Treasurer's Report November 2023

The Finance Committee met on Dec. 21 to work on the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 operating budget. Our main goal is to maintain a budget that ensures that the community is properly funded for current and future projects. The proposed budget will be presented to the BOD for approval at our January meeting.

Current financial status in ACNB and M&T

ACNB - \$1,224,438.51 @ ≅5.1% estimated annualized returns \$624,11.00

M&T - \$1,484,930.08 @≅5.1% estimated annualized returns \$75,731.00

Note: In both cases, monies were not fully invested at the beginning of the fiscal year and the M&T account includes operational monies that are consumed each month by operations. The result of this is the estimated annualized returns will be greater than the actual returns. Also, many of the CDs pay their interest at maturity, so monthly interest statements are difficult to interpret.

Annual audit: Is "in process", the final report will be available in the future.

A reserve study is a vital planning tool that gives our association an honest assessment of where we stand both physically and financially. It's like having an investment strategy where we set aside funds today to cover future expenses such as roads, mechanical equipment, the community center and other portions of our community's common elements.

Reserve studies consist of two parts;

Financial Analysis- This examines LHPOA financials such as income and expenses. It also takes the current reserve fund into account.

Physical Analysis- This examines the physical condition of association common elements along with the estimated cost of repair/replacement.

Our Reserve Study was conducted by the Falcon group: The full report is available in the office for examination. We encourage members to read the Reserve Study to have a better understanding of Lake finances and why our dues increase in order to maintain all LH amenities.

Some highlights:


- 1. The roads should be sealed every 5 years.
- 2. 2024 \$48K in repairs including recreation areas and maintenance equipment
- 3. 2025 \$92K in repairs including a new mower and restrooms in the Community Center.
- 4. 2026 \$371K in repairs including resurfacing the pool and security.
- 5. 2027 \$191K in repairs including the kitchen in the Community Center and boat launch.


In total, the \$702K (\$176K per year) will consume more than the funds typically budgeted for the Capital Reserves (\$125K/year) for that period. Fortunately the loan to ourselves for the alum treatment ends in the 25/26 fiscal year freeing up \$81K/year for future work. Unfortunately, none of this includes the requisite work on the spillway to meet Pennsylvania's new standards.

You are invited to join finance committee meetings held monthly on the third Thursday at 5PM in the CC where we conduct an in depth review of our financial status.

TAILS FROM THE FISHING CLUB DECEMBER 8, 2023 MEETING



Fifty-seven members and guests got a jump on the Holiday Season with a "Christmas Morning Breakfast" potluck at our monthly meeting on December 8th. The Community Center reflected the holiday spirit, including music, colorful table settings, Christmas-themed centerpieces, and eggnog punch. Club members shared their favorite breakfast dishes and casseroles with all the traditional ingredients (such as ham, eggs, sausage, hash browns, cheese, waffles and french toast) as well many sweets and fruits. Thanks also to our hosts for helping create a fun evening.

Prior to the start of the business meeting, Phyllis "Diller" French delivered a hilarious standup comedy routine on the challenges of aging. She masterfully completed an item from her bucket list to the delight of the audience.

President Steve Oakes ran the business meeting. Treasurer Ernie Clevinger presented the end of November 2023 financial status (spreadsheets were at each table). He summarized that month's income and expenditures and reported \$7,332.05 in funds on hand, including \$1,251.95 earmarked for the Club's Veterans Initiative. The Treasurer's report was approved by the members. Ernie then presented a proposed 2024 Fishing Club budget (a copy was at each table). He reviewed major income and expense categories with forecasts of membership, 50/50 earnings and fundraisers based on past experience. The budget plan would have the Fishing Club raise and spend \$6,460 next year, not including the Veterans funds. The 2024 budget was approved by the members.

The Secretary's report of the November 10th meeting was approved by the members. We celebrated three December birthdays and four anniversaries. One couple was celebrating their 50th anniversary day at the Club Meeting! Celebrants were treated to Little Debbie Christmas Tree Brownies or North Pole Nutty Buddys. Two members sporting festive holiday sweaters were also recognized.

In old business: (I) Ernie proposed the distribution of veterans funds to a veteran in need as well as a local non-profit. After discussion, the members approved providing \$500 to a single woman veteran with two children (identified by Stan Clark - Adams County Veterans Affairs Office), and \$200 to "Roots for Boots" (a local non-profit that supports veterans). (2) Ernie noted the lake level is being drawn down - valve is fully open, but recent rains are slowing down the draw.

In new business/member input: (1) Steve noted the canned goods brought to the club meeting today will be donated to SCCAP (South Central Community Action Programs). Thank you for your generosity. (2) Beth Bauer updated members on the Family Dinner and Bingo Night, Friday, February 23, 2024. Volunteers are critical to this fundraiser's success. Plans are shaping up for soupmakers, and a signup sheet will be circulated at next month's meeting. Members also supported a proposed price increase for the meal and game cards. Don't forget to identify some bingo prizes (for kids or adults) to donate for the event. (3) Karen Reed noted the difficulty with seeing painted street lines at night, suggesting this may be an issue the Fishing Club may want to raise to the LHPOA Board. (4) Liz Haberman promoted the sale of the Lake Heritage Women's Club Cookbook (\$15).

The next Fishing Club meeting is Friday, January 12th. Hosts are Phyllis and Brian French, Pat and Dave Diehl, and Gloria and Gary Serrao.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:06 p.m.

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
