

If you haven't submitted a request for pool passes yet, please complete the form and send it to admin@lakeheritage.org, drop it off at the LH Office during operational hours, or use either dropbox location. Please note that pool passes will only be printed on Fridays and can be picked up from the Pool House with our Pool staff.

Additionally, Maintenance will conduct the first of two scheduled maintenance days at the Lake Heritage Boat Trailer area on Monday, June 9th. All members with a current spot must remove their boat and trailer by Sunday, June 8th, and may return them to the area on Monday evening. In the event of inclement weather requiring rescheduling, we will send an email to inform the community.

Please remember that any members who have not paid their 2024/2025 FY Dues and Assessments will be considered delinquent as of June 15th. A motion to suspend membership privileges will be made at the July 11 Board Meeting. For any questions regarding your homeowner account, please contact the Office, which is open Monday-Friday from 7:30 AM to 5:30 PM.

Due to blue green algae blooms beginning to form, we had our first lake treatment of the year in May. At this time, the treatment has remarkably improved the health of our lake and eliminated the growth of the blooms. As we continue our summer maintenance, please consider the following: DON'T:

- Blow the grass into the lake
- Blow the grass into swales/culverts
- Blow the grass into the roadways
- Use Phosphorus fertilizers

DO:

• Keep your grass below nine inches. If there is a wet swale on your property, it is okay to leave it longer until it dries out enough to mow or trim it.

Summertime has officially kicked off! The Pool opened with great reviews. The Maintenance staff put in long hours to repaint the bathhouse, ensure hot water is working, and installed new shower heads to increase water pressure. The pool was filled early, maintained and heated up by the sun. Our Pool staff arrived and put the finishing touches to start the summer season on a great note.

Maintenance also worked hard to beautify rec areas. Many trees, limbs, and stumps were removed in the last month. New mulch was added to Shady Grove and the Community Center areas.

The Team will be working on mowing and weeding the rec areas all summer long. A new toilet will be installed in the Community Center bathroom. Intersections are being cleared of debris left over from the winter.

Access and Patrol have been working hard to keep members and visitors alike safe as the weather warms up. There is still an issue noted of Stop sign compliance. This has been noted at both the front entrance and at several locations on the property. Please obey the stop signs and come to a complete stop in all locations to keep other drivers, pedestrians, and yourself safe.

Runoff from pet waste can carry harmful bacteria and other unwanted organisms into Lake Heritage that are dangerous to swimmers and wildlife.

The quality of the lake we love and enjoy depends on everyone's responsible actions.

- Flies can spread serious diseases found in pet waste to children and physically sensitive individuals who are at high risk of infection from bacteria.
- Excessive organic matter in pet waste can cause algae blooms that block sunlight and kill important underwater vegetation. Decaying pet waste can also deplete critical oxygen which fish and other aquatic life need to live.

Please bag pet waste and use the trash totes positioned at all Lake Heritage Recreation Areas, including the Boat Access for safe disposal.

Pool Facility Upgrades

Your pool facility has a host of upgrades for your safety and enjoyment this year. The pool was drained, power washed, refilled, and chemically treated for clear, algae-free, safe, balanced water for you to enjoy. With a new hot water heater in the bath house, new shower heads, and freshly painted locker room interiors, you can also enjoy a luxurious hot shower before and after you swim. Another very important upgrade this year is a new chemical controller in your baby pool. While this is more behind the scenes, it will ensure that we will have much fewer closures of that pool this year, and the water levels will remain more consistently balanced and safe for our littlest pool patrons and their guardians. Another wonderful upgrade is an additional hand rail at the shallow end steps going into the big pool, so patrons may hold two rails with both hands as they enter and exit the pool. Your maintenance team, pool committee, community manager, and board president have been working hard behind the scenes for months on these upgrades, so be sure to say "thanks" when you see them.

New Seasonal Guest Pass Available

A new type of guest pass will be available for purchase this year. For \$75, you may buy a pass for a guest for the entire season. That non-resident guest must always be accompanied by a resident, so this is not intended for people outside of the Lake Heritage community to just join the pool independently. It should be a useful option for Lake Heritage families who have nannies, grandparents, or other caregivers for children who enjoy the pool. (The Lake Heritage resident accompanying the guest is allowed to be a child.) Our usual daily guest passes will continue to be offered for \$3 for the day, and punch cards will continue to be available at 10 punches for \$25 and 20 punches for \$40.

Snack Bar Updates

You will find some new, more substantial items on our snack bar this year, including microwavable foods like corn dogs, pretzels, and hot pockets. These items will be sold individually wrapped/sealed, and you are invited to microwave them yourself in our new community microwave located at the pool pavilion. (Lifeguards are not trained/certified food preparers, so we thank patrons for microwaving and handling your own food for both safety and legal reasons.) Our snack bar prices will remain famously low this year, so be sure to buy your snacks at the pool instead of at the corner store!

Lifeguard Team

You have an amazing team of lifeguards here to keep you safe and ensure a pleasant pool experience. All lifeguards are Red Cross certified in lifeguarding, CPR, and first aid. Many guards have additional certifications in things like containing bloodborne pathogens, giving emergency oxygen, administering EpiPen, etc. In addition to their Red Cross trainings, the safety team goes through weekly in-service trainings where we drill our emergency action plans, practice with the AED, review surveillance techniques, and stay fresh on our lifeguarding and first aid skills. Several of your lifeguards are local champion swimmers and college athlete swimmers, and all of them are very accomplished young people in a variety of ways. I couldn't be more proud of your safety team. Your pool manager is me, Rachel, returning from last year. In addition to Red Cross certifications, I also hold a PA state pesticide applicator license, which authorizes me to administer all the chemicals you need to keep your pool safe and clean. Your assistant manager will also be a familiar face, Hannah, who has worked at your pool for the last several years. Your senior guard is Finn, another very experienced lifeguard. You will also likely recognize Sam, another seasoned lifeguarding veteran and college swimmer like Hannah and Finn. Expect to see some combination of those folks at the pool pretty much every day. Other returning guards include Zach, Leah, Morgan, Maya, Addison, Gavin, Danny, Rob, and India. You will also notice some new faces this year, including Andre, Makenna, Carmen, Claire, Mackenzie, William, and Cole. This is a large safety team, which enables these busy young people to take their summer vacations and balance work with other activities such as athletics. Be sure to thank your lifeguards for their hard work!

Swim Lessons

We will be offering youth swim lessons for all ages as well as a "mommy/daddy and me" class for infants and their caregivers. More details about times, dates, and fees will be forthcoming as we plan multiple sessions, including mornings and afternoons. As the sessions are planned, information will become available at the pool office, main office, and will be emailed out to the community.

2024 Lake Heritage Memorial Commemorative Observance

Lake Heritage residents and extended community gave honor to our country's fallen heroes at the annual Memorial Commemorative Event on Sunday, May 26 at Shady Grove. Those individuals in attendance who in past or are currently serving in our country's military service were given recognition as well.

Master of Ceremonies was COL Dave Franz USA (RET). LH President Renee Trybula gave a welcome message. Keynote Speaker, Senior Chief Therese Orr USNR (Ret) and Lake Heritage resident, delivered a very meaningful address. The invocation was given by Rev. Richard Ginnever, LH Board Member. Marie Chantelau read the patriotic poem, "Just a Common Soldier" and rang the bell to remember Lake Heritage service individuals who have been lost since last year. SFC Steve Oakes USA (Ret) spoke about LH Veteran's Support Program and the ongoing community fundraising initiative called "The Boot". Taps was played by Retired Sergeant First Class Mitch Mummert. Posting of the Colors was provided by Gettysburg High School JROTC Color Guard. Raising of the flag was done by Lake Heritage Board Member SSG Tom Reidenbach USA (Ret).

The program included a three-fire cannon gun salute by 1st Maryland Artillery/Rigby's Battery Civil War reenacting soldiers. The unit, active since the 1990's, follows strict artillery procedures of the US Field Artillery Association and use an 1852 reproduction model 12 Pound Howitzer and limber.

LHPOA resides on land that was occupied by and fought over during the Gettysburg 1863 battle.

May we who live on this land today never take freedom for granted nor forget those who served and sacrificed their lives.

























Commemorative Speaker Therese Orr's Keynote Speech

> Memorial Day Celebration, 2024



After Navy boot camp and Intelligence Specialist school I was stationed on Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. For our last two years in Hawaii, we lived in an Enlisted cottage along "battleship row". Fast forward a few decades and I'm a Licensed Battlefield Guide at Gettysburg National Military Park and one of several Guides who provides free nightly tours of the Soldiers National Cemetery in the summer. The route from my parking spot to the start of the tour takes me past the World War II graves near the Baltimore Street entrance of the cemetery. My eyes are drawn to dates such as June 6, 1944 and December 7, 1941. Today, I would like to tell you about one of the servicemen buried there.

George Joseph Stembrosky, Jr. was born on 30 Jan 1921 in Coaldale, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania. He was the youngest of four children of George and Mary. George, Sr. was from Lithuania. He was a coal miner in Schuylkill County. Mary was from Maizeville, Pennsylvania.

George played basketball & football for Coaldale High School, graduating in 1940. He enlisted on 16 Oct 1940 in Philadelphia. Following boot camp and further training he was assigned to the battleship USS NEVADA, BB-36. He reported aboard on 10 DEC 1940 as

an Apprentice Seaman. On 01 DEC 41 he was promoted to Seaman 1st Class, an E-3 today.

USS NEVADA was the oldest of the battleships moored in Pearl Harbor, at one end of the line. The ship's band was playing in preparation for morning Colors on 07 DEC 1941, a date, in Franklin Roosevelt's words, "that will live in infamy". At 0755 Japanese planes began their assault upon "battleship

row". NEVADA was struck in the port side by a torpedo, resulting in numerous leaks. Not having ships moored inboard or outboard, she managed to get underway and started to steam towards the harbor entrance. The slow-moving battleship was an attractive target for the Japanese dive bombers, which hit her at least six times, possibly as many as ten. More leaks sprang up in her hull, and numerous fires blazed as well. To avoid blocking the entrance to the harbor, NEVADA was run aground near Hospital Point on the opposite side of the harbor from Ford Island. By the following day she had settled to the bottom of the harbor in shallow water.

During this attack S1C George Stembrosky was killed. His family received a telegram on December 24th informing them of his death. Later, his family received a letter from George's Commanding Officer, CDR Thompson.

George "performed his duties under heavy enemy fire in the manner expected of all Americans. Although his shipmates are deeply grieved over his loss, they are proud of the fact he performed his duties in accordance with the highest traditions of the Naval Service. It is hoped you will derive some measure of comfort from the fact that he gave his life in defense of our country in order that we might continue to enjoy the freedom that we have inherited."

George was one of 50 Officers and Enlisted men killed on the USS NEVADA on 07 December.

He was most likely buried at O'ahu Cemetery, which only had 300 burial spaces remaining, or at Halawa Naval Cemetery, created to bury the dead from the attack on Pearl Harbor.

A bill was passed in 1947 offering the families of those servicemembers buried overseas the option of having their loved ones reinterred elsewhere.

George's body arrived via Army transport ship in San Francisco, then travelled by train to Philadelphia. A military escort brought him to Gettysburg where he was reinterred on

07 Nov 1947, with family & members of the Stembrosky-Katchak VFW

in attendance. That VFW was named for George Stembrosky and John Katchak, both of Coaldale and both killed on 07 December 1941.

Tomorrow, Memorial Day, let us remember and honor those

Americans who, in the words of Abraham Lincoln, gave the "last full measure of devotion" that we might continue to enjoy our freedoms. Young men like George Stembrosky, who will forever be just a few weeks shy of his 21st birthday.



Contest Rules and Regulations:

1. DATE/TIME - Saturday, June 1, 2024, 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

2. Registration - No pre-registration necessary but get and read the rules before fishing.

3. Participation - Open to all LH Property Owners. The owners' non-resident family and friends are welcome, BUT the Lot Owner must be present at the weigh-in. Lot owners are responsible for all their Participants, whether family or guests. All Lake Heritage Property Owners' Association Rules and Regulations must be observed.

4. Weigh-in - 2:00PM until 5:00 PM at Fishing Point (behind Community Center). You will need to present the Lot Owner's name, Lot Number, and names of Participants.

5. Weigh-in Procedure - Fish may be brought to be weighed in plastic buckets (preferred), plastic bags or coolers. Fish must be weighed at the area and time specified in paragraph 4. Fish to be disposed of do not have to be kept cold.

6. Acceptable Fish – ADDED in 2023 - CATFish. Catfish and White Perch may be brought in for weigh-in. Must be caught during the hours of the tournament and be brought in for the weigh-in. Anyone bringing in fish caught outside the hours of the tournament hours will be Disqualified.

7. Awards - Money (.50 cents per pound) and medals will be presented to children 16-under as you weigh in.

8. Tackle Rules - All fish must be caught on conventional fishing tackle with hooks and live or artificial bait. You must supply your own bait. Fish may not be netted out of lake, unless first caught on a hook. The number of rods and hooks legal under PA laws are allowed.

9. Licensing - All adults must have a PA fishing license. Any boy or girl 15 years old or younger does not need a PA fishing license. Anyone 16 years or older does need a PA fishing license. Incense.

10. Penalties - Killing of wrong fish will be punishable by weight deduction before Reward. The weight reduction is 8-lbs. for each wrong fish; cash equivalent of \$4.00. As stated above, fish not caught during the tournament hours should not be turned in. If you do, you will be disqualified!

11. Fish Retention - People desiring to keep the white perch to eat should keep them alive and cold or otherwise preserved. Bring them to weigh-in to be counted before gutting.

12. Littering - Do not litter with any material including bait containers and dead fish. Dead fish will be disposed of by tournament officials.

13. Fishing Areas - Everyone may fish from all public access areas around the lake as well as from LHPOA registered boats containing all safety requirements mandated by PA law. You may fish from private lots on the waterfront only with the permission of the owners.

14 Tournament End Time - The tournament is over at precisely 5:00 PM. You must be in line at the weigh-in station by 5:00 PM or your fish will not be weighed.
